In what ways would you like me to be happy at school?

How do you hope school will influence my future?

How do you hope teachers talk to me at school - tone, mannerisms, language?

How do you hope other students talk to me while I'm at school?

How do you hope I will treat other students and teachers while I'm at school?

How would you like my school to communicate with you, and what would you like to know?

What do you think would help make my school an inviting and comfortable place for you?

My school is taking the Pink Shirt Day challenge to Korero Mai, Kōrero Atu, Mauri Tū, Mauri Ora - Speak Up, Stand Together, Stop Bullying. What do you hope this will mean for me?
