Characteristics

The largest of its kind, kōtukutuku is one of the 'fuchsia' family. One of only a few trees native to Aotearoa that are deciduous (a rākau who loses leaves in the winter).

Kōtukutuku bears small flowers that change from greenish-yellow to purple-red.

Kōtukutuku also grow dark purple berries, known as kōnini by Māori, which are edible and taste a bit like tamarillos.

Birds are big fans of kōtukutuku! Manu such as tūī, korimako, and tauhou love to eat the nectar from the flowers.
