Characteristics

Kōtuku are considered a very rare and special sight here in Aotearoa!

There is only one colony of kōtuku in Aotearoa — a spot near Whataroa, South Westland.

Kōtuku use their long beak to feed on small fish, wading through the water with their long, featherless legs!

Tīpuna Māori noticed that kōtuku eat very elegantly and carefully.

"He kōtuku kai whakaata" is a whakataukī that compares someone with good manners to the kōtuku.
