## Characteristics

Torea are stocky birds with bright-coloured bills.

They can be found 'fishing' for their kai around coastal areas — that's where they get their English name, oystercatchers.

There are different kinds of oystercatchers, but some can live for a long time! South Island pied oystercatchers can live up to 27 years.

Known for their good timing, torea go out fishing when the tide is low and then return to land. This is talked about in the whakataukī: **Ka whati te tai, ka pao te torea, '**When the tide recedes, the torea strikes'
