Characteristics

Rimu is one of our tallest trees, growing up to 50 metres tall and usually living 550–650 years.

Like kahikatea, rimu have been extensively cut down by people for their valuable timbers.

Also called 'red pine', rimu is related to other pine trees but doesn't produce pinecones.

'Rimu' can also mean seaweed, and if you look at the leaves you'll see why they share a name!
