Characteristics

Kākā are a large native parrot with a powerful voice.

They love to flock together and have loud chats in the early morning and late evening. Sometimes the call sounds a bit like "ketekete!"

Kākā are forest birds that get all their food from trees. They used to be a lot more common, but now they are pretty rare!

MEKA MANU

"He kākā wahanui" is a whakataukī that can refer to an excellent speaker, but literally means, "a big-mouthed kākā".

The big voice and personality of the kākā led to it being compared to leaders and speakers.
