Genus: Philesturnus





Characteristics

Tieke are small with strong legs! They easily bounce from rākau to rākau. When something is being done too much, you can use the whakatauki: **Me he wai tā tieke**, 'like the water spread around by a saddleback'. Since tieke are energetic bathers!

Tieke only survive on predator free islands. They have developed different tunes after 50 years of being scattered amongst offshore islands. These new songs have meant they can have trouble understanding tieke from other areas.

Singing can be so fun!

Sometimes we might sound really different to others, but that never stopped the proud tīeke from belting out a tune! Can you stand strong in your singing? You might be like a tieke!

Tieke mainly eat insects, but also fruit and nectar too. They are great seed dispersers and help pollinate flowers!
